Maharashtra becomes first state to cap prices of masks

ADB approves 300 million US dollar loan to finance water supply, sanitation infrastructure in Rajasthan

India and the Asian Development Bank (ADB) signed a 300 million US dollar loan to finance inclusive and sustainable water supply and sanitation infrastructure and services in 14 secondary towns of the state of Rajasthan. The signatories to the Rajasthan Secondary Towns Development Sector Project were Sameer Kumar Khare, Additional Secretary in the Ministry of Finance and Takeo Konishi, Country Director of ADB's India Resident Mission.

Kerala introduces high-tech digital classrooms in all its public schools

Kerala, the highly literate state, is pioneering digital classroom technology. And it is introducing high-tech classrooms in all its public schools. Kerala Infrastructure and Technology for Education (KITE) has implemented the project which comes under the general education department. Over 3.74 lakh digital equipments were distributed in 16,027 schools for the smart classroom project. Apart from KIIFB fund, the asset development funds of public representatives and local government funds were also utilized for the project.











Union Cabinet okays ₹520 cr package under NRLM for Jammu & Kashmir, Ladakh

The BJP-led National Democratic Alliance government will extend its National Rural Livelihoods Mission (NRLM) aimed at increasing household incomes in rural areas to the two newly created Union territories of Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh. The programme, aimed at women, will ensure they get better access to credit facilities.

"SAKHI" One-Stop Service Centre for women inaugurated in Ramban district of Jammu and Kashmir

"SAKHI" One-Stop Service Centre for women in Ramban district. The Ministry has been implementing a scheme for setting up One Stop Centres since April 2015 to support women affected by violence. The scheme aims to facilitate access to an integrated range of services including medical aid, police assistance and legal aid or case management, psycho-social counselling and temporary support services to women affected by violence. Under the scheme, it has been envisaged that One Stop Centre would be set up across the country at district level in a phased manner.

Maharashtra govt to probe Jalyukt Shivar water conservation scheme

Maharashtra government will probe the Jalyukt Shivar water conservation scheme launched by the Devendra Fadnavis- led government. The "Jalyukt Shivar Abhiyaan", launched with the objective of making Maharashtra a drought-free state by 2019; involved deepening and widening of streams, construction of cement and earthen stop dams besides digging of farm ponds.

Gujarat govt announces setting up of world's biggest Zinc Smelter project in Dosawada in Tapi district

Gujarat government has announced the setting up of the world's biggest Zinc Smelter project in Dosawada in Tapi district. The Memorandum of Understanding for this project was signed with Vedanta Group. The proposed 300 KTPA production capacity project would provide big employment opportunities to the local youths in this tribal area. The first phase of the proposed plant will be operational in 36 months. The project with the investment of Rs.10 thousand crore will also have a State-of-the-art Research and Development Centre.

MP Police begins initiative to connect Banchhara, Kanjar communities with mainstream society

Madhya Pradesh police have started an initiative to connect Banchhara and Kanjar community with the mainstream of the society. These communities are known for their criminal activities. This is the first of its kind of attempt in Madhya Pradesh. Ratlam SP Gaurav Tiwari informed that the youth of these communities are getting free training and employment in private companies. Efforts are also being made to provide them opportunities in police recruitment.













UP govt decides to set up women help desk in every police station of state

Telangana Dharani portal to safeguard ownership of immovable property

Dharani project, the Telangana government's online facility for enlistment of nonagricultural properties, has been conceptualised as a comprehensive system for safeguarding ownership and streamlining transactions related to immovable properties in the state. A digital database of agricultural properties has already been created and Pattadar passbooks (green) have been issued. Now, a similar database is proposed to be created for non-agricultural properties for which maroon colour Non-Agriculture Immovable Property Passbooks (NPBs) will be issued.

Asan Conservation Reserve has become Uttarakhand's first Ramsar site, making it a 'Wetland of International Importance', announced the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change. The Reserve is located on the banks of Yamuna river near Dehradun district in Garhwal region of the Himalayan state.

Odisha CM Naveen Patnaik launches 'Mo Bidyut' portal, app

With the opening of this BRTS corridor, Surat has become the only city in the country to have the longest BRTS network of 108 km. Tamil Nadu govt implements Smart Black Board scheme in 80,000 govt schools

Tamil Nadu government is implementing the Smart Black Board scheme in 80,000 government schools to ensure a better teaching environment. The Smart Black Board scheme envisages usage of audio visual teaching material that can be fed into the computer screens in classes using widely available pen drives. He said the recovery on global energy markets would be slow in the wake of the second wave of the coronavirus pandemic.

India and France re-elected as the president and co- president of ISA

India and France were re-elected as the president and co- president respectively of the International Solar Alliance (ISA) for a two-year term at its third assembly. Fiji and Nauru chosen as vice-presidents for Asia Pacific Region, Mauritius and Niger vice-presidents for Africa Region.

World Bank approves \$12 billion for covid-19 vaccines

The World Bank had approved \$12 billion for developing countries to finance the purchase and distribution of Covid-19 vaccines, tests and treatment. The money is part of an overall World Bank Group (WBG) package of up to \$160 billion through June 2021 designed to help developing countries battle the novel coronavirus pandemic.

India to deliver Kilo Class submarine INS Sindhuvir to Myanmar Navy

India will be delivering a Kilo Class submarine INS Sindhuvir to Myanmar Navy as part of defence cooperation. This will be the first submarine of the Myanmar Navy.

India contributes 1 million dollars to UNRWA for Palestine Refugees

India has contributed one million dollars to the United Nations Relief and Works Agency (UNRWA) for Palestine Refugees in the Near East. This aid will support the Agency's programmes and services, including education, health care, relief and social services.

A film museum was inaugurated at the Bangladesh Film Archive Bhaban in Dhaka on Wednesday. India, Chile hold first joint commission meeting

India and Chile held their first joint commission meeting and agreed to add new momentum to their relations in a wide range of fields including trade and commerce, agriculture, health and social security, defence and space. Chile will also be opening its Consulate General in Mumbai.

India hosts virtual Summit of Ministers of Justice of Shanghai Cooperation Organisation

India hosted the virtual Summit of Ministers of Justice of Shanghai Cooperation Organisation, SCO. The Ministers of Justice from SCO Member States, Law and Justice Minister Ravi Shankar Prasad highlighted the initiatives taken by the Indian Government for providing affordable and easy access to justice for all. He mentioned Pro Bono Legal Services to provide free legal aid to marginalized sections of the society.

New Zealand PM Jacinda Ardern wins second term in landslide election victory

Jacinda Ardern has won a second term as New Zealand's Prime Minister after her success at handling the country's coronavirus outbreak helped secure a landslide victory. She is to be elected as the PM for the second consecutive three-years term.

Singapore Becomes First Country to Use Facial Recognition to Pay Taxes

Singapore became the world first country to introduce facial recognition for accessing online government services. This technology is being rolled out to the city-state's SingPass digital identity scheme, offering access to no less than 400 online services, including tax declarations and public housing applications. Facial recognition is also increasingly being used to access other online services, such as banking. The function is designed to work via home computers, tablets and cell phones, as well as at public kiosks.

India , Netherlands collaborate in e-health initiative

India and the Netherlands discussed a joint thrust in the e-health sector with the purpose of providing digital health facilities and security to Indians and helping the Netherlands accelerate the digital transformation of health. Part of India's ambitious National Digital Health Mission (NDHM), this collaboration will see the two countries work closely to create capacities and put in place the requisite technology backbone to enable this revolutionary initiative.











18th meeting of SCO Prosecutors General held via video link

India participated in the 18th meeting of the Prosecutors General of SCOvia video conference. The sides inter alia agreed to strengthen cooperation in preventing and combating corruption, mutual legal assistance, exchange of regulatory legal acts. Representing India, Solicitor General Tushar Mehta attended the meeting. India will host the next meeting of Prosecutors General in 2021. The eight member bloc is holding this year's SCO Council of Heads of Govt on 30th Nov which will be hosted by India.

Japan to achieve zero carbon emissions by 2050

Japanese Prime Minister Yoshihide Suga has said that the country will achieve zero carbon emissions by 2050. As per Japan's current energy plan, 56 percent of its energy requirements come from fossil fuels.

Bangladesh govt. orders 'no mask, no service' policy

The Bangladesh government has decided that no service will be provided to people who don't wear masks. The cabinet meeting Chaired by Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina decided that no one will be allowed to enter offices without the mask. It decided that all offices must install notice boards saying 'no mask, no service' in order to control the spread of COVID 19 virus in the country.

The 8th India-Mexico Joint Commission Meeting was held through Video-Conference. The Meeting was co-chaired by External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar and his Mexican counterpart Marcelo Ebrard. RBI launches surveys on consumer confidence, inflation expectations

The Reserve Bank has launched the latest round of surveys to capture consumer confidence and inflation expectations of households, which are useful inputs for its monetary policy. The consumer confidence survey seeks qualitative responses from households regarding their sentiments on the general economic situation.
